The ensemble regularly performs at venues such as the Vienna Musikverein, Theater an der Wien, Brucknerhaus Linz, Mozarteum Salzburg, Carinthischer Sommer, Barocktage Melk, Palau de la Musica Barcelona as well as Valencia and at Händelfestspiele Halle.

The repertoire ranges from intimate chamber music to grand operas and oratorios. In the spirit of the chamber music origin, concertmaster Agnes Stradner unites the core members of the ensemble in diverse concert programs, often in dialogue with video art, dance or literature.

TV music productions Winterklang and the traditional Easter Concerts are broadcast worldwide by ORF, 3sat and other TV stations. CD recordings have been released by Sony, Harmonia mundi and Gramola.
